The following represents the Manager's report for the Borough Council meeting of July 8, 2019.

Beach Project Update - Island Beach - Attached to this report is a proposal for architect services for the Island Beach portion of the beach project. In the early phases of Birchwood, we quickly realized the value of engaging an architect at the beginning of the process. Reasons for the architect include the need for certified construction documents for the construction permitting process and also for continuity of work between the various trades on the project. Additionally, because Island Beach will be significantly different from the original design, the project will need to be rebid, which will require architectural drawings.

Currently, the DPW committee is recommending a single structure design that is similar to Birchwood. Replicating the Birchwood design affords us the greatest opportunity for success at Island Beach. Additional reasons for the single structure approach include cost savings to build one structure vs. two and the best use of the property.

Since time is a significant consideration if the project is to finish prior to the start of the 2020 summer season, I am asking that anyone who has any issues proceeding in this manner reach out to me (or a DPW committee councilmember) so questions and / or concerns can be addressed. It is my goal to engage the project architect on or before July 10th.
