BOROUGH COUNCIL DISCUSSION ITEMS

Tax Assessor Discussion Regarding Revaluation

Tax Assessor, Rick DelGuercio, discussed revaluation. The last revaluation in Mountain Lakes was conducted in 2006. In 2012 a reassessment was conducted to reflect market conditions in response to the housing crisis of 2008-2009.

Mr. DelGuercio advised that the Morris County Board of Taxation determines which municipalities in Morris County need to conduct a revaluation. The Board primarily uses three criteria to determine when it's appropriate for a revaluation: time since last revaluation, current ratio of sale prices compared to assessed value and the coefficient of deviation. Beside these three criteria, the Board takes the amount of tax appeals into consideration.

Mr. DelGuercio estimates Mountain Lakes will be ordered by the Morris County Board of Taxation to conduct a revaluation within two years. Once ordered, a municipality has approximately two years to comply with the revaluation order and it takes approximately a year to complete the revaluation. The cost of a revaluation is between \$125,000 and \$150,000. The municipality may apply for a bond to pay for a revaluation.

Mr. DelGuercio advised that a cheaper alternative to revaluation may be to conduct a reassessment with full inspection. Mr. DelGuercio advised that after a municipality performs a revaluation or full inspection reassessment, they have the option of conducting an annual maintenance assessment. Doing so avoids having to conduct future revaluations since adjustments are made yearly. Mr. DelGuercio also noted that annual maintenance assessments reduce incidents of tax appeals. Mr. DelGuercio will provide information about the costs for a revaluation, reassessment with full inspections and annual maintenance assessment.

The consensus of the Council was for Mr. DelGuercio to speak with the County Tax Board about the situation in Mountain Lakes and determine options.

2020 Budget



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The following department operating budget proposals were discussed: Library, Police, Traffic & Safety, Dispatch, Municipal Court, Office of Emergency Management, Fire Department, Code Enforcement, Administration, Clerk, Finance. Also discussed was the Current Budget revenue projections.
