Mayor Shepherd led the salute to the flag.

COMMUNITY ANNOUNCEMENTS

REPORTS OF BOROUGH ESTABLISHED BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES Public Works Committee – Island Beach & Birchwood Lake Update

Public Works Committee Members Borough Manager Stern, Recreation Director Karen Brennfleck, Deputy Mayor Menard and Councilmember Barnett gave a presentation on the status of the Island Beach & Birchwood Lake projects. The council asked questions to the committee members and the committee members answered them. The majority of the council approved the location of the swing set that was proposed by the committee and also agreed to postpone paving the Island Beach parking lot.

Councilmember Happer requested that the Public Works Committee consult the Historic Preservation Committee about repairing the Island Beach retaining wall.

Borough Manager Stern agreed to provide an accounting of the cost savings for the Island Beach and Birchwood Lake projects.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mayor Shepherd opened the meeting to the public.



Deb Shertzer - 5 Lookout Road, requested a breakdown of the \$225,000 cost savings of the Island Beach & Birchwood Lake projects.

Steve Shaw – 4 Pointview Place, questioned if the Borough submits its construction projects to the NJ Historic Preservation Office for review. Mr. Shaw expressed his disappointment with the Borough reducing the hours of the Borough recycling center and questioned if the recycling attendant will remain at the recycling center after the hours are reduced.

Island Beach Retaining Wall

Mr. Stern reported that the Borough will be repairing the two sections of the Island Beach retaining wall that are failing.

Mountain and Wildwood Lake Lowering

Mr. Stern reported that in accordance with the Borough's NJ DEP permit, lowering of the Mountain and Wildwood lakes has begun. He advised that the lowered level would continue until December 1st, at which time the lakes would be allowed to naturally refill.

R147-20 approved with the following change to the last paragraph: "Now therefore be it resolved, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Mountain Lakes, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, that the Borough Council hereby supports a ban on single-use plastic bags by retail establishments statewide and urges Governor Murphy to sign



the Legislation adopted by the Legislature instituting such a ban and supports the efforts of the Mountain Lakes Environmental Commission to raise awareness of the damaging effects of plastic bag usage".

COUNCIL REPORTS

Shared Services – Mayor Shepherd reported that the Borough and the Mountain Lakes Board of Education discussed the tennis courts, storm warning system and updates to their shared services agreement. No decisions were made.



Planning Board – Deputy Mayor Menard reported that the board reviewed Ordinance #03-20 which was found to be consistent with the Master Plan and Mayor Shepherd reported that the public hearing for the Zeri's Inn property is scheduled for October 22nd.

Recreation Commission – Councilmember Korman reported that the commission is working on a recommendation for the use of Borough facilities by resident business owners.

Library – Councilmember Korman reported that the Mountain Lakes Library and the Morris County Library are open to the public. The community rooms at both libraries are closed.

Green Team – Councilmember Horst reported that the committee chair has stepped down and the committee is working on finding a replacement.

Public Works - Councilmember Barnett reported that the Public Works Department has been working hard on storm cleanup.

Woodlands Committee- Councilmember Happer reported that the committee is working with the DPW to clean up the storm damage on the Borough trails and parks.

Borough Hall Advisory Committee – Deputy Mayor Menard reported the following: The project manager is working on the final construction drawings and preliminary project estimate; The committee reviewed interior and exterior finish materials; The committee anticipates that construction will start in November.

Lakes Management Advisory Committee - Deputy Mayor Menard reported the following: The committee is holding a canal cleanup on October 17th; Machinery cannot be used for lake wall repairs; The committee is looking into applying for a NJ DEP permit that would allow lake hydro-raking and dredging.
