Councilmember Korman announced the following: Mountain Lakes High School held a wonderful performance of Romeo and Juliet on November 21st and November 22nd; The Garden Club will be hosting a Holiday Greens Workshop on December 9th.

Councilmember Lane congratulated the Mountain Lakes High School girls soccer team and girls tennis team for winning their championship games.

Councilmember Barnett congratulated the girls cross county team on their big win.

Mayor Shepherd congratulated the Mountain Lakes/Boonton Township Social Justice Media Club for hosting a successful "Courageous Conversations" webinar.

REPORTS OF BOROUGH ESTABLISHED BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES

Economic Development Advisory Committee – Borough Profile

Mayor Shepherd gave a presentation on the proposed Borough Profile. The Borough Profile provides an overview of Mountain Lakes that includes testimonials, information on population and demographics, local businesses, amenities, and commuting information. The Council asked questions of Mayor Shepherd and he answered them. The Council approved the Borough Profile be posted on the website after the suggested corrections are made.

Cathy Hadjiloucas - 5 Lakewood Drive, questioned if the Borough received the environmental report from the former Speedway property on Route 46 when it was demolished.

Borough Manager advised that Licensed Site Remediation Professional (LSRP) has up to 1 year to produce the report.

MANAGER'S REPORT

Boulevard / Pocono Road / N. Pocono Road Intersection

Mr. Stern reported that in 2019, Morris County began investigating improvements to the intersection with the understanding that any upgrades would be on a cost share basis with the Borough. The estimate to upgrade the intersection is \$309,775 and the Borough's share is \$90,432.50. This project will be included in the 2021 capital budget request.

Holiday Tree Lighting and Menorah Lighting

Mr. Stern reported that the tree lighting is scheduled for December 6th at 5pm and the Menorah lighting December 13th at 5pm. The Borough has adjusted the events to ensure compliance with NJ Covid-19 executive orders.

JCP&L Annual Tree Trimming

Mr. Stern reported that JCP&L contractors will be performing line clearance tree trimming along JCP&L's rights-of-way beginning on or about January 4, 2021.

COUNCIL REPORTS

Planning Board – Mayor Shepherd reported that the board carried the Highview application and that the Park Lakes Tennis Club application will be continuing on November 30th. Deputy Mayor Menard reported that Planning Board Chairperson Martin Kane nominated Kelly Holliday for the Borough Hall Renovation Project Committee.

Affordable Housing Committee – Councilmember Korman thanked the Council for adopting the Mountain Lakes Accessory Apartment Manual and reported that the committee is working on preparing a resident mailer to announce the accessory apartment program.

Shade Tree Commission – Councilmember Barnett reported that the commission is working on finalizing the prune/removal list and the tree planting list.

Environmental Commission – Councilmember Lane reported the following: The commission discussed the botanical garden project at the Mountain Lakes High School and thanked Bednar Landscaping for their generosity and help; The commission discussed the tree planting project on Rt. 46 and advised that Parsippany is interested in participating. The commission is researching funding options for the project; The commission is working with the Woodlands Commission to set up a maintenance schedule for the Birchwood Lake rain garden; The Stormwater Management Committee meeting was rescheduled.

Historic Preservation Committee – Councilmember Horst reported the following: The committee is looking into creating a map of QR codes of historical Borough sites; Jill Gotthelf was appointed to the Morris County Historic Preservation Review Board; The committee is researching locations to store its archives that are currently housed at the Mountain Lakes Library.

Woodlands Committee – Councilmember Happer reported the following: The committee discussed using QR codes for Borough trails; The committee recommended that the Council appoint Scott Allison to the committee; Student committee member Keval Mehta is restoring the trail entrances off of Maple Way for his eagle scout project; The committee discussed the status of their 2020 budget and the upcoming 2021 budget.

DPW Committee – Deputy Mayor Menard reported the following: The committee discussed the status of the recycling center and its new hours; The stone wall at Island Beach has been completed and stayed within its budget; The committee is doing its final review of the Borough hall renovation project budget; The committee agreed to purchase wood picnic tables for Island Beach and put benches outside the showers; The committee discussed the railroad station stairs; The committee discussed the Kaufman Park tree and recommended that the Borough plant a new tree after the tree dies.
