Mr. Oostdyk reported that the deadline for tax appeals has been extended due to the State of Emergency caused by the Coronavirus Pandemic. The deadline will be determined after the Emergency Declaration is completed.

MANAGER'S REPORT

Coronavirus (Covid-19) State of Emergency

Mr. Stern reported that due to the Coronavirus (Covid-19) Pandemic, the State of New Jersey is operating under Executive Orders 104, 105 and 106.

Police Chief and OEM Coordinator Shawn Bennett gave an update on how the Borough is dealing with the Coronavirus Pandemic.

Cancelled Events

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COUNCIL REPORTS

Councilmember Korman reported that the Affordable Housing Committee is working on an accessory apartment program manual. Borough Manager Stern will check on the status of the manual with CGP&H (Community Grants, Planning & Housing).

Councilmember Barnett reported that the Shade Tree Commission changed their monthly meetings and they will now be meeting the 1st Monday of the month at 7pm. The Shade Tree Commission reviewed the prune/removal list. The Shade Tree Commission discussed Island Beach and Birchwood Beach projects. The Shade Tree Commission is working on a contingency plan for Arbor Day due to the Coronavirus Pandemic.

Deputy Mayor Menard reported that the Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC) reviewed the status of Ordinance 3-20 (Eastbound Route 46). EDAC will begin making recommendations for Westbound Route 46. Deputy Mayor Menard advised that EDAC will review the Borough Profile when it is completed.

Deputy Mayor Menard reported that the Island beach project is moving along and the DPW committee is finalizing the swing sets.

Deputy Mayor Menard reported that the Mountain Lakes Board of Education budget is short one million dollars and the Board of Education is requesting that the Borough Council consider funding the Briarcliff School sports programs. The Borough Council would like a formal request.

Councilmember Lane reported that the Environmental Commission has restarted the Mountain Lakes Pollution Prevention Team and they will be meeting in September 2020 and April 2021. Councilmember Lane reported that the raingarden at Birchwood Lake has received approval from Borough Manager Stern and now needs Council approval to proceed. The Council requested a sketch of the Island Beach raingarden's location. The Environmental Commission is exploring locations at Island Beach to put a raingarden. The Environmental Commission is working on various school initiatives. Councilmember Lane reported that Eco Weekend is scheduled for April 17th and 18th.

Councilmember Happer reported that the Woodlands Committee is working with the Department of Public Works to put up "No Dumping" signs in the Borough and fix broken trail signs. The Woodlands Committee is working on getting a trail easement behind the King of King's Church property. The Woodlands Committee is focusing on using social media to communicate with the public.

Councilmember Horst reported that the Green Team initiatives are being impacted by the Covid-19 Pandemic because they are socially centered.

Matt DeSantis – 12 Center Drive, requested that the Council rethink moving forward with the Borough Hall Renovation Project and purchasing the Mountain Lakes Club property due to the economic impact of the Coronavirus Pandemic. Mr. DeSantis stated he does not want the Borough to buy the Mountain Lakes Club and requested that the Council consider other solutions for the property.

Pearl Ferdico - 250 Boulevard, requested that tonight's Council meeting be posted online.
