# REPORTS OF BOROUGH ESTABLISHED BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Mayor Shepherd opened the meeting to the public.

Robert Imbert – 130 Midvale Road, owner of Mountain Lakes Bagel, is opposed to the proposed single use plastic ban ordinance and questioned if the ordinance would apply to all Borough businesses.

#### **BOROUGH COUNCIL DISCUSSION ITEMS**

#### Westbound Rt. 46 Zone Change Proposal

Joe Di Pompeo, chair of the Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC), was unable to attend the Council meeting so EDAC members Mayor Shepherd, Deputy Mayor Menard and Councilmember Horst provided an update on the committee's proposed zone changes for Route 46 Westbound. The Council had a lengthy discussion and requested that EDAC address the following items: Nursing homes as a use; Bulk standards; Tree canopy preservation; Having the same setbacks as OL-1 and OL-2 zone. Councilmember Barnett (Liaison to Shade Tree) agreed to advise the Shade Tree Commission of the council's request to investigate amending the current tree removal ordinance to apply to mixed use residential locations.

## Single Use Plastic Ban Proposed Ordinance



The council discussed the single use plastic bag ban ordinance proposed by the Mountain Lakes Environmental Commission (MLEC). Mimi Kaplan, Chair of the MLEC, was in attendance and reported back to the council on the feedback from the businesses that would be impacted by the proposed ordinance. Ms. Kaplan advised that the majority of the nine Borough businesses were in support of the proposed ordinance. Ms. Kaplan also advised that the New Jersey legislature has passed a single-use bag ban and it is awaiting the governor's signature to become law. The Council asked questions of Mrs. Kaplan and Mrs. Kaplan answered them.

# Public Comment on Single Use Plastic Ban Proposed Ordinance

Mayor Shepherd opened the meeting to the public.

Robert Imbert – 130 Midvale Road, owner of Mountain Lakes Bagel, is opposed to the proposed single use plastic bag ban ordinance and requested that the council not move forward with it. Mr. Imbert advised that he nor his wife were contacted about the proposed ordinance.

Briana Ostosky - 8 Rainbow Trail, requested that the council ensure that the opinions of residents are heard and are considered when making decisions/laws. She also requested that the borough not reduce current setbacks on any zoning ordinances.

Deb Shertzer - 5 Lookout Road, expressed concern of passing a plastic bag ban ordinance when the borough requires its residents to purchase plastic garbage bags to dispose of their trash.

Dena Muniz - 7 Rainbow Trail, expressed her support of the proposed single use plastic bag ban ordinance.

Sara Jordan - 23 Laurelwood Drive, questioned how long the council will wait for the NJ governor to sign the state's single use bag ban law before deciding to move forward with the borough's proposed single use plastic bag ban ordinance.

George Jackson – 20 Sherwood Drive, is in favor of the council delaying moving forward with the proposed single use plastic bag ban ordinance since the state's single use bag ban is awaiting the Governor's signature to become law. Mr. Jackson suggested that the council express their support of the state's single use bag ban law via a resolution.

All Councilmembers commented and expressed their position on the proposed single use plastic bag ban ordinance. The majority of the council decided to draft a resolution to support the state's plastic bag ban and urge Governor Murphy to sign the legislation instituting a statewide ban. The majority of the council decided to postpone the introduction of the borough's proposed single use plastic bag ban ordinance.

#### **Affordable Housing Accessory Apartments Program**

Blair Schleicher-Wilson, chair of the Affordable Housing Advisory Committee, gave a presentation on the committee's proposed affordable accessory apartment program. The council discussed and asked questions of Ms. Schleicher-Wilson and she answered them. The Affordable Housing Advisory Committee is requesting that the council approve the Accessory Apartment Policies & Procedures Manual at the October 12<sup>th</sup> council meeting.

### **ATTORNEY'S REPORT**

Mr. Oostdyk had nothing to report.

#### **MANAGER'S REPORT**

#### **Building Department**

Mr. Stern reported that due to a lack of support staff and an increase in workload, the Borough Construction Official has been unable to complete various tasks including completing building permit applications, plan reviews, Open Public Records Act (OPRA) requests and addressing older permits. Mr. Stern is requesting council approval of a salary resolution to hire a temporary part-time employee to assist the Construction office and advised that the personnel subcommittee supports this request.



# Signs

Councilmember Happer requested that the Borough Manager ensure that enforcement of the borough's sign ordinance is consistent. Mr. Stern advised that information on the borough's sign ordinance will be included in the weekly email blast.

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Mayor Shepherd opened the meeting to the public.

Dena Muniz - 7 Rainbow Trail, expressed concern with zoning changes and she is opposed to zone changes in "Zone D".

Cathy Hadjiloucas - 5 Lakewood Drive, expressed concern with zoning changes and she requested that the council delay passing any zoning ordinances until after the Covid-19 pandemic. Ms. Hadjiloucas offered a suggestion on language to include in the zoning ordinance.

Michael Hollick - 9 Lakewood Drive, suggested that zoning be done on a property by property basis.

Ellen Foppes - 29 Rainbow Trail, expressed concern that the proposed zoning changes could affect traffic and requested that the borough conduct a traffic study.



Borough Attorney Oostdyk advised that spot zoning is not allowed.
