COUNCIL REPORTS

Economic Development Advisory Committee – Councilmember Richter reported that the committee discussed rezoning Westbound Route 46, modifying bulk standards in the OL-1 and OL-2 zones of Westbound Route 46 and residential buffering. Councilmember Korman reported that the committee discussed updating the Borough Profile.

Finance Advisory Committee – Councilmember Barnett reported that the committee discussed debt service and the long-term capital plan. Councilmember Richter advised that the committee would like to review the capital plan next year before the capital ordinance is adopted.

Shade Tree Commission – Councilmember Korman reported the following: The commission is preparing for Arbor Day; The commission reviewed the Highview development tree management plan for the Planning Board; The Borough received a seedling from a 500-year-old oak tree from the NJDEP and the committee discussed where the seedling should be planted.

Woodlands Committee – Councilmember Lane reported that committee continued to discuss the illegal dumping in the Borough pocket parks.

DPW Committee – Mayor Menard reported that the committee discussed the following: beach opening, building additional paddle board racks at the Bird Sanctuary, preparations for upcoming paving projects; proposed Eagle Scout project a Kaufmann Park; Trash Day preparations, Island Beach sand replenishment, tennis court repairs, and constructing a pickle ball court.

Historic Preservation Committee – Councilmember Korman reported the following: The committee continued to discuss alternative locations to the library to store the archives; The committee's annual open house will be on May 22nd.
