ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Mr. Oostdyk advised that Resolution 112-22 was not part of the consent agenda because some councilmembers have voting conflicts.

MANAGER'S REPORT

Borough Manager Stern provided his report (attached). The council discussed the new law requiring identification and replacement of lead water lines, the DOT road grant application for Morris Avenue between Powerville Road and Fanny Road, and the Powerville Road tennis courts. The council asked questions of Mr. Stern and Mr. Stern answered them.

The council is in favor of proceeding with Core & Main's \$21,705.00 proposal for lead line identification and directed Mr. Stern to move forward. The council requested that Mr. Stern revise the Notice of Lead Service Line Material Letter to make it clear that the Borough is determining which lines have the potential for the presence of lead.

The council is not in favor of including sidewalks on the Morris Avenue DOT grant application.

COUNCIL REPORTS

Solid Waste Committee – Borough Manager Stern reported that the committee is in favor of residents having two 35-gallon garbage containers weighing no more than 50 pounds and also advised that construction debris, white metal goods and electronics will not be picked up on bulk trash day.

Economic Development Advisory Committee – Councilmember Korman reported that the committee is working on zoning recommendations for Westbound Route 46 and updating the Borough Profile. The committee also discussed commercial cannabis kitchens.

Shade Tree Commission – Councilmember Korman reported that Parsippany received 20 tree saplings from JCP&L to replace the trees that they cut down on Intervale Road.

Zoning Board – Councilmember Richter reported that the board memorialized resolutions from the previous meeting.

Recreation Commission – Mayor Menard reported that the commission discussed the Independence Day fireworks, bench program and the success of the trout derby and Easter egg hunt. Mayor Menard also reported that a plaque will be hung at the tennis courts recognizing Mark and Ginny O'Donnell for their contributions to the Borough.

DPW Committee – Mayor Menard reported that the committee discussed the following: beach opening, preparations for upcoming paving projects, deep root feeding of the Kaufmann Park Christmas tree, Memorial Day preparations and Island Beach sand replenishment.

Historic Preservation Committee – Councilmember Korman reported the following: The committee had a successful open house; The committee continued to discuss alternative locations to the library to store the archives; The committee is interested in using money in the Mountain lakes Centennial Committee fund and requested information on the process to do so. Borough Manager Stern advised Ms. Korman that the committee needs to draft a proposal to present to the council.

Council member Barnett requested that the Borough Council consider passing a resolution supporting NJ Assembly Bill A-3804/S-330, which would restore distributions to municipalities from the Energy Tax Receipts Property Tax Municipal Distribution Program (ETR) over two years and require additional funding to be subtracted from the municipal property tax levy.
