COMMUNITY ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mayor Barnett congratulated the Mountain Lakes School District on securing a \$1.2M grant for a turf field project that will be located behind Briarcliff School, known as the Pit, and advised that the Board of Education (BOE) is requesting to acquire the Borough's portion of the property. Mayor Barnett explained the process of transferring Borough-owned land. The Borough Council supports moving forward on the BOE's request to acquire the property and is awaiting information from the BOE including a Title Search, the grant application and agreement, detailed project plans, and a write-up of how the new field will be utilized. As soon as the Borough receives the requested information, the Borough Council will schedule a public discussion.

Mayor Barnett announced that rack and ring renewal begins March 3rd.

Councilmember Tsai reported that the Mountain Lakes second-grade Brownie Troop and the sixth-grade Cadet Girl Scouts visited Borough Hall and held civic engagement activities. The Boy Scouts will visit Borough Hall in April.

ORDINANCE 1-25

CALENDAR YEAR 2025 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Mountain Lakes in the County of Morris finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2025 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 2.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$181,650.23 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Mountain Lakes, in the County of Morris, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2025 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Mountain Lakes shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$254,310.32, and that the CY 2025 municipal budget for the Borough of Mountain Lakes be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

ORDINANCE 2-25

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 173 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF MOUNTAIN LAKES AND AMENDING THE RULES GOVERNING LAKES, PARKS, AND SPECIAL USE FACILITIES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Mountain Lakes, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 173 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Mountain Lakes, Section 173-1 entitled "Lakes, Parks, and Special Use Facilities", shall be amended by the following amendment to subsection N. which shall read, in its entirety, as follows:

N. Bicycles and other vehicles. Any conveyance, including motor vehicles, trailers of all types, campers, tricycles, bicycles (motorized or otherwise), sleds, sleighs, pushcarts, and all other vehicles propelled by muscular power or otherwise, horses and horse-drawn conveyances, excluding, however, baby carriages and bicycles and vehicles used by Borough employees in an official capacity, are prohibited within those areas of the park known as the "Richard M. Wilcox Park" marked for foot traffic only as shown on a "Trail Map, Environmental Commission, Borough of Mountain Lakes", prepared by Anderson & Denzler Associates, Inc, current version dated January, 7, 2025 and as may be amended in the future.

Section 2. If any section or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid in any Court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the other sections or provisions of this Ordinance, except so far as the section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances, which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CHAPTER 111 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF MOUNTAIN LAKES AND REVISING THE FEE SCHEDULE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Mountain Lakes, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 111, Section 111-3 entitled "Fee Schedule", of the Revised General Ordinance of the Borough of Mountain Lakes, Subsection B "Construction Code" shall be amended to read, in its entirety, as follows:
